





Why raw materials matter?

Aim to secure sustainable supplies of raw materials

Launched in 2008, consolidated in 2011

Non-energy, non-agricultural raw materials

Connecting EU external and internal policies

Integrated strategy (3 pillars)

Introduced a list of Critical Raw Materials (CRM) in 2011

Policy strongly supported by EIP on Raw Materials

Ensure level playing field in access to resources in third countries

Foster sustainable supply from European sources

Boost resource efficiency and recycling




